EDUCATE AS ENTRY

The phased growth plan uses the EDUCATE program as the first program to go into a new county. This program doesn't require any additional staff since it is implemented by a tutoring agency. The tutoring agency works in all counties in Florida.

PROGRAM BY PROGRAM

By using a program-by-program entry strategy FFC can capitalize on donors wanting to help launch each program in their county. This also allows FFC to slowly work out any issues in that county before launching all the programs there. Additionally, it allows FFC to get early data along the way to use for fundraising.

Implement ENRICH data tracking of Safe Spaces in Orange, Osceola

FFC has just got permission to track every youth that comes through our safe spaces' rooms. This will allow FFC to show its large impact on kids that come into care. There is no staff needed for this as it's a passive tracking system. This step is just filling out our data procedures to make sure every youth we impact is tracked.

Implement EDUCATE Program in Lake County

The EDUCATE program is launching tutoring in Lake County and the youth there are excited to be served with this life-changing service. The Educate program is implemented by outside tutors. Current program staff have capacity to implement this program, but with continued evaluation needed to ensure administrative capacity continues.

FFC's board approved \$50k for this work and that should translate to serving around 50 new foster youth.

Data is being tracked and is being used for fundraising.



ESTIMATED ADDITIONAL COST: \$50.000

ESTIMATED ADDITIONAL YOUTH SERVED: 50

Implement EMPOWER Program by adding 6 Advocates for Orange, Osceola, and Seminole

In order to fill out FFC's advocate program, FFC is hiring 6 advocates. These positions have already been funded through new grants won this year. These advocates will ensure there is no waiting list for youth trying to get into the advocate program and continue to implement this one-of-a-kind program.

\$300k is needed for salaries (\$40k salary plus benefits/taxes per advocate) \$150k is needed for youth empower resources (\$1650 per youth)

ESTIMATED ADDITIONAL COSTS: \$450.000

ESTIMATED ADDITIONAL YOUTH SERVED: 90

FFC would launch the ENRICH program into Lake County. The Enrich program is implemented by approving requests from caregivers and foster youth. Current program staff have capacity to implement this program, but with evaluation needed to ensure administrative capacity continues.

→ ESTIMATED ADDITIONAL COST: \$100,000 → ESTIMATED ADDITIONAL YOUTH SERVED: 250

 Launch Pilot of EDUCATE Program in Brevard County

\$100k is needed for salaries (\$40k salary plus benefits/taxes per advocate) \$50k is needed for youth empower resources (\$1650 per youth)

PHASE #3 2025-2027 Detailed

Launch Pilot of ENRICH Sports/Arts/Safe Spaces in Brevard County (+200 kids)

FFC would launch the ENRICH program into Brevard County. FFC would bring on a program coordinator to help manage the increased processing of requests.



 Launch Pilot of EDUCATE Program in Polk County
 The EDUCATE program would launch tutoring in Polk County to serve the youth with this life-changing service. No staff would be needed as this program is implemented by a tutoring agency that already works there.

 \$50k would serve about 50 kids, after that service would be dependent on the amount of money raised in the county for tutoring.

 FFC will make sure that data is being tracked and is being used for fundraising.

Launch EMPOWER Program with 4 Advocates to Brevard County (+60 kids) FFC would place 4 advocates in Brevard County, using the GPS tracking and log in system. They would return to FFC offices once a week for training and team duties. After the first year, money in Brevard County would be used to support and maintain the program.

\$200k is needed for salaries (\$40k salary plus benefits/taxes per advocate) \$100k is needed for youth empower resources (\$1650 per youth)

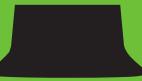

Operations Initiatives:

Grow Admin and Fundraising

ED adjusts schedule to work from multiple counties for donor relations As with most nonprofits, Admin and Fundraising lags behind Programs growth due to the tendency to receive restricted dollars. FFC will have to make strategic decisions to grow these departments while assisting the leaders of those departments.

The ED will need to change working patterns to allow 2-3 days per week to meet with donors and stakeholders in new counties. The counties being evaluated are all within 1-2 hours drive and it is possible to do this with solid leadership from department leaders.

Program staff will continue to have required in office time and track hours using GPS Program staff currently work out of the office most days and new staff in new counties will have a similar schedule. By using GPS tracking FFC is able to capture the work of each staff no matter where they are working from.

Kids and Counties Overview

Determining the number of kids in foster care can be a difficult thing as the system is always in flux, however FFC has looked at the numbers over the past year by pulling the DCF and Embrace databases and removing those youth in mental health treatment centers and those placed out of state. The number below represents, to the best of FFC's knowledge, the number of kids available to serve in each county.

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FFC can't force kids to join its programs, so the best approach is to have enough capacity to serve all the kids and hope that most of them will join. By the end of Phase 3, FFC should be positioned to meet the needs of the youth in the counties.
